The Government has published its sustainability strategy to improve the education sector's response to climate change by 2030.

Therefore, the DfE have tasked schools to create an environmentally sustainable action plan, in order to equip our children with the knowledge and understanding of the world around them and the issues surrounding our global environment.

Therefore, Governors will be looking into this as an area to establish and develop within school.

The DfE's strategy (summarised below) sets out a lot of goals between now and 2030. Therefore, it won't all be completed at once. However, a clear pathway and timeline will be developed, so that Governors, parents and children will be able to see the progress that we are making towards the goals of a more sustainable future.

The DfE's Strategy's Main Aims

Curriculum

Aim: To offer young people a better knowledge and understanding of climate change and a connection to nature e.g. teaching children about environmental issues and preparing them for a world impacted by climate change.

Community

Aim: To inspire young people to choose – and give them the skills and knowledge they need for – career paths that support the transition to net zero, the restoration of biodiversity and a sustainable future e.g. through assemblies and teaching, help pupils to see and learn about a wide range of green careers and skills in action.

School Premises

Aim: To improve the physical environment in and around education settings so that it is resilient to the impacts of climate change and inspires young people and others to live sustainable lives e.g. energy efficient lighting/growing more plants and trees.

Culture

Aim: To encourage schools to operate and regulate in a way that introduces pupils to more sustainable practices, such as: waste prevention / resource efficiency e.g. turning lights off / reduce printing on paper.
