<p>Number Hunt – Write down the numbers 1-10, either around your house/on your daily walk, how many times can you find each number e.g. on clock, microwave, door numbers, bus numbers etc</p>	<p>Personal, Social and Emotional Communication and Language Literacy Development – Reading Mathematical Development</p>
