Reception

Our week got off to a fabulous start with the news of the arrival of Mr Lees' daughter Daisy. The children have all seen a photograph and everyone is doing well. We have been learning all about Chinese New Year this week with the children finding out how there came to be years named after animals. We have learnt all of the animals and the order in which they finished the race. This has helped us learn our ordinal numbers. We have been using our scissor skills to cut out shapes and create our own dragons and in PE have been using streamers to create our own dances. We worked in pairs to make our own dances and mirrored each other's moves. We then got to perform our dances to the rest of the class. In maths this week we have continued to look at how we can represent information we find out, so have been completing tally, block and pictograms. In our phonics and kinetic letters sessions we are now having a focus on writing short sentences. We are encouraging the children to think of a sentence, and write it word by word reading back what they have already written to help them recall what comes next. Please encourage your children to write in lots of different fun ways at home. Today we have been tasting Chinese food and have been discussing our likes and dislikes. Next week we begin a new topic, about recycling and looking after our planet. We will also discuss the plastic pollution problem and the effect this has on our oceans.
