| Issue Raised | Outcome |

| Lockdown procedure – to provide further information about the lockdown procedure for parents. | In the afternoon, we conducted a test and immediately afterwards we informed parents via text. Unfortunately, on this occasion, the timing of the test prevented earlier notification of it to you as parents to allow preparation for questions that might be asked by your children. |
| | We were pleased that the test was successful and that it provided conformation that we now have in place a plan to protect your children from any unforeseen eventuality. It has been brought to our attention that some parents have expressed concern that advance notification of the test had not been provided. We believe that it is important for you to understand that tests of this nature must necessarily be conducted without prior notification to enable us to assess the reactions of all staff and pupils. |
| Behaviour from Crestwood pupils | It was reported by parents that this had been a lot better, as staff from Crestwood and Bromley Hills had gone out at the end of the day. |
| Screening for the fencing on Bromley Lane (especially by the bus stop) Crossing patrol/warden in Bromley Lane. Appreciate this is a local authority issue but can we have a update please? | The Governors agreed the cost of this and it has been arranged with a gardening company, who will come and plant this term. School had been notified that, due to Local Authority cutbacks, the service would stop and no replacement provided. This has happened across the whole of Dudley. |
| Why are we no longer able to use the Brier car park when dropping and picking children up from breakfast/after school club? Are there any alternatives? | The Brier car park has been upgraded and a new one way system is in place. Therefore, parents have been asked not to park there, as this blocks the one way system for their mini busses, as they can't get past. Staff have reported that some parents have given verbal abuse when asked not to park there. |
| When scheduling school events please be mindful of working parents. December was a really busy month. Could the violin and trombone assemblies have taken place in January/February rather than in December? | The music assemblies happen when each class has finished learning to play that instrument, as classes take it in turns each term. If this is a concern, then school will look at alternatives. |
| The new online payment and booking service is great. Is it possible to save payment details on Eduspot (school dinners, clubs etc)? | School will enquire with Eduspot and let parents know. |
| Homework cape out late last week, is it possible to display homework sheets in playground (on notice board). Or is it available via an App? | School will look at providing this. |
| If you want to be added to the mailing list for school newsletter how do you do this? | Parents are asked to let the school office know and they will add you to the addresses. |
| Children have been upset that their attendance was not 100% so they didn't get an award. Is there another way of getting attendance data to parents rather than handing children a brown envelope at the end of term? | School can look at alternative ways of sending information to parents. |
| Can we have a list of food items that are allowed as part of healthy eating/tuck policy? Is cheese allowed? Are any cereal bars allowed? | School will provide this as part of the healthy eating week this term. |
