

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ATTENDANCE POLICY

The school attendance policy has been updated, and a copy can be found on the school website. The main points to remember are:

- > Children should arrive in school between **8:45am and 8:55am** (if late, please ensure that you take your child to the school office). School gates are locked at 9am.
- Registers are marked by 9:05am. Pupils arriving after this time (but before 9:25am) will receive a late mark (L).
- > **The register closes at 9:25am.** Pupils attending after 9:25am will receive the mark U to show that they arrived after the registers have closed.
- > If your child is unwell and won't be attending school, parents are to contact the school office via telephone by 9am on the first day of the absence, with an explanation of why they are absent.
- Absences will be authorised on the following grounds:
 - •An absence for sickness for which the school has granted leave;
 - •Medical or dental appointments which unavoidably fall during school time, for which the school has granted leave;
 - •Religious or cultural observances for which the school has granted leave;
 - •An absence due to a family emergency.

> Unauthorised absence:

Parents keeping children off school unnecessarily or without reason;

Truancy before or during the school day;

Absences which have never been properly explained;

Arrival at school after the register has closed;

Absence due to shopping, looking after other children or birthdays;

Absence due to day trips and holidays in term-time which have not been agreed;

Leaving school for no reason during the day.

Persistent absenteeism:

Missing 10 percent or more of schooling across the year for any reason.

Please remember: All absences must be authorised by the headteacher. Parents MUST request an absence in writing. School will refer cases to the Education Support Services (ESS) where children are persistently absent.
