Dear Parents/Carers,

First of all, I would like to say a big thank you to parents/carers, who have brought their child to school this week, for following the protocols that we have put in place. This has been really helpful for us in ensuring that everyone is kept safe. The children have settled in well and it is great to see that the systems that we have put in place have worked.

Secondly, I would like to remind you that our teaching groups are limited to 10 children per group, as identified on our risk assessment (which can be found on the school website). Therefore, once the limit has been reached, we cannot allow any more children into that group. So, if you are intending on sending your child back to school (in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 only) please email myself or the info box sooner rather than later. Our Pre-School has now reached its maximum limit.

Can I remind you that teachers are putting work onto the online classrooms on Microsoft TEAMS on a weekly basis. We have sent out usernames and passwords. Please can you encourage your child to complete the work set. If you don't have computer access, please let the school office know and we can arrange a paper copy to be either sent or collected from school.

End of Year Reports

Due to the current situation, the Government has instructed schools to produce a reduced end of year report this year. The DfE has recognised that they won't be the usual reports, which traditionally gives end of year assessments in all curriculum areas.

Therefore, you will be receiving a reduced end of year report in July, which gives a teacher assessment for Maths, English and Science and a target for maths and English.

Teachers will also make a general comment about your child as well.

Infection Control Procedures

The protocols that have been sent to parents/carers state what to do if your child is unwell; i.e. if your child shows any signs or symptoms, they must remain at home for 7 days. If anyone in the household has the virus, they must stay at home for 14 days.

All children who show signs of the virus *must* be tested. If you are not sure about how to go about getting a test, we can ask the school nurse to support you.

Children who have been tested must stay at home until the results of the test are known. Only then, will they be allowed back into school if all clear.
